INSURANCE POLICY

The Council of Police Sport UK has taken a limited liability Personal injury Policy of insurance to cover any Competitor, Official or Committee Member of Police Sport UK aged between 16 and 65 years, who is participating or officiating at any Championship organised on behalf of the Police Sport UK, and who as a result of receiving serious bodily injury, dies or is permanently disabled resulting in their being retired from their force.

A condition of the Insurance Policy is that notice must be given to the Insurance Company of any injury which might give rise to a claim, as soon as reasonably practicable and in any case within 21 days of the occurrence.

In order to comply with requirements both the organisers of the European Invitational Badminton Championship and the Police Sport UK office must be informed of any such incident immediately.

These conditions must be brought to the attention of all competitors by their inclusion in entry forms for the Championships. Competitors requiring additional Insurance cover are advised to consult their own Insurance Companies.

TRANSPORT TO SPORTS VENUE

Transport will operate between the hotel and sports venue with the first mini-bus leaving at 08:15 hours on Saturday morning and running a shuttle service until all competitors are at the sports venue. As there are a large number of competitors and guests that have arrived by plane and train it would be appreciated if those that have their own vehicles with them could assist with transport for our colleagues.

Return trips to the hotel will be made as requested by competitors.

Transport will again operate between the hotel and sports venue with the first mini-bus leaving at 08:30 hours on Sunday morning.

Sports Hall

We have exclusive use of the sports hall within Aberdeen Sports Village and will be using 6 courts. There is a gallery seating area that overlooks the courts and competitors are requested to remain in this area until called to play.

There are changing rooms adjacent to the sports hall.

Refreshments

The cafeteria in the Sports Village will be open for the purchase of drinks and light refreshments throughout the day. No food is permitted within the sports hall.

Security

There are lockers available within the changing rooms and the management have requested that no valuables are left unattended within the changing rooms.

First Aid

As would be expected of such a facility there will be fully trained first aid staff on the premises with a first aid room available if required.

Ice packs and a basic first aid kit will be available at the referees table.



SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TEAM EVENT

- The team-leaders have to provide the Tournament organiser (Robin Ripley) with a complete list of players on each team. This must be done no later than 21:00 hours on Friday 22 October 2010.
- 2 A team-match contains 5 individual matches. I ladies' doubles, I men's doubles, I mixed doubles, I men's singles and I ladies' singles.
- A team must contain at least 2 women and 2 men. There can't be more than 4 women and 4 men in any team.
- 4 The team-match will be played in the following order:
 - I Ladies' doubles
 - 2 Men's doubles
 - 3 Mixed doubles
 - 4 Men's singles
 - 5 Ladies' singles
- All team players must play at least 1 match in every teammatch. No player is allowed to play more than 2 matches in a team match.
- 6 If a player is injured during a match, and the team wish to use a reserve-player, then the team-leader must contact the tournament organisers (Robin Ripley and Colin Ross) for approval.
- Prior to each team match the team-leader must complete the "Team composition form" and hand it to the referee.
- 8 The referee will issue a "Match Form" and "Scoresheets" to the team leaders. On conclusion of the match the "Match Form" and "Scoresheets" are to be signed by both team-leaders and returned to the referee.
- 9 As the preliminary stages of the team event are being played on a round robin basis there will be no setting during the pool stages.

COMPETITION RULES INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

- All events will be the best of 3 games to 21 points with setting.
- When a Match is called the Players will collect their Match Sheet from the Referee's Table. Upon completion of the match the winner(s) will complete the sheet and return it immediately to the Referee's table.
- 3 Singles competitors MUST be ready for play at 0900 hours on Sunday 24 October 20:10 and All other competitors MUST be ready from 09:30 hours
- 4 Suitable badminton clothing MUST be worn. No leisure clothing is acceptable, e.g. running or cycling shorts. No tracksuits to be worn during play
- 5 Warm up time will be restricted to 3 minutes.
- 6 The laws relating to the Badminton Hall (Faults and Lets) will be decided on the day.
- Any player wishing to deviate from the rules for medical reasons will be asked to produce medical evidence to the Referee before the commencement of play.
- 8 Any Competitor with further matches to play who wishes to leave the hall during competition hours, MUST first report to the Referee, and also advise him of their return.
- 9 Competitors are reminded of the Police Sport UK ruling that if a player is not available to play when required, the Organising Committee, at their discretion, can eliminate the player.
- 10 In the event of a dispute arising as to the interpretation of these rules, the decision of the Tournament Committee is final.
- 11 The Tournament Committee shall decide any points not covered by these rules.
- 12 During the tournament the REFEREES DECISION IS FINAL.

ANTI-DOPING CODE OF ETHICS

Police Sport UK Council adopts a zero tolerance to drugs in sport. Doping constitutes a violation of the WADA World Anti-Doping Code.

Violations of Anti-Doping Regulations are:

- The presence of prohibited substances, its metabodies or markers in the athlete's bodily specimen.
 - It is each athlete's personal duty to ensure that no prohibited substances enter his or her body. Athletes are responsible for any prohibited substance or its metabodies or markers found to be present in their bodily specimens. Accordingly, it is not necessary that intent or negligence on the athlete's part be demonstrated in order to establish an anti-doping violation.
 - The presence of any quantity of prohibited substance or its metabodies or markers in an athlete's sample shall constitute an antidoping violation, excepting those substances for which a quantitative threshold is specifically identified in the WADA "list of Prohibited Substances and Methods"
 - As an exception to the general rule, the WADA "List of Prohibited Substances and Methods" may establish special criteria for the evaluation or prohibited substances that can be produced by the body itself (endogenously).
- 2 Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or a prohibited method.
 - The success or failure of the use of a prohibited substance or prohibited method is not material. It is sufficient that the prohibited substance or prohibited method was used or attempted to be used for an anti-doping rule violation to be committed.
 - Refusing, or failing without compelling justification, to submit to sample collection after notification as authorised by the Sports Governing Body, or otherwise attempting to willingly evade sample collection.
 - Tampering or attempting to tamper with any part of the doping-control.
- 3 Possession of prohibited substances and prohibited methods.
 - Possession by an athlete
 - Possession by an athlete at any time or place of substances that are prohibited in out-of-competition testing in accordance with the WADA Prohibited List or the use of prohibited List or the use of prohibited methods by an athlete, unless the athlete establishes that the possession is pursuant to a Therapeutic Use Exception granted or other acceptable justification.
 - Possession by athletes support personnel
 - Possession by athletes support personnel of substances that are prohibited in out-of-competition testing in accordance with WADA Prohibited List or the prohibited methods by athlete support personnel (in particular doctors, trainers/coaches, attendants and support staff) in connection with an athlete, competition or training, unless the athlete support personnel establishes that the possession is pursuant to a Therapeutic Use Exemption granted to the athlete or other acceptable justification.
- 4 Trafficking in any prohibited substance or prohibited method.
- Administration or attempted administration of prohibited substances or prohibited methods to any athlete or assisting, encouraging, aiding, abetting, covering up or any type of complicity involving anti-doping violation or any attempted violation of the anti-doping regulations.
- Participation or attempted participation in any Police Sport UK organised event during a period of suspension or ineligibility imposed by any International or National Sports Governing Body.
